

School Year 2017/18

Bottesford CE Primary School will receive £18,750 of Sports Premium funding for the academic year 2017/18. This money will be spent on providing the following opportunities in order to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport that we offer:

The above table is further detailed as follows:

- Hire specialist qualified sports coaches that will be timetabled to work alongside our teachers in order to develop high quality teaching for the future.
- Hire specialist qualified sports coaches that will support specific curriculum areas for all pupils each week.
- Provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively.
- Happy Lunchtime training with Steve Harris for Wellbeing Education
- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs.
- Introduce new sports and activities, to that currently on offer, and encourage more pupils to take up sport.

- Increase pupils' participation in the School Games.
- Develop the provision of Outdoor Adventurous Activities (OAA).
- Develop the school grounds and improve our facilities.
- To help with transport costs to sporting venues/tournaments.
- Make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

The aim of this investment is to improve the lifestyles, overall health and fitness of the pupils and the quality of teaching available to all pupils in the school. We also aim to continue to provide opportunities for pupils to experience sporting activities that they may not access out of school.

In addition to this, we aim to build on our successes in local Vale tournaments and in tournament within the Melton schools group so that more trophies can be added to our collection. This will build on the Olympic legacy and encourage our children to aim high, persevere, practise respect, experience joy of effort, pursue excellence and learn fair play.

School Year 2016/17 Outcome

Bottesford CE Primary received £9,250 of Sports Premium funding for the academic year 2015/16.

Coupled with money allocated from our designated after school sports clubs, the sports premium was spent in a number of different ways to support the provision of improved quality of sports and PE for all pupils:
